KINDNESS

As you are aware we have been promoting Kindness at school as way to create a sense of community and connectedness. Unfortunately there are some behaviours that we are experiencing at the moment that can lead to unhappy children, conflict and sometimes bullying. The concerning behaviours are around the way children (a few - but still too many) talk to, and talk about, each other.

We (children and teachers together) have set out some expected behaviours. They seem simple enough when they're written down and the majority of our children use appropriate language for most of the time.

This is the message we're giving at school. Your reinforcement of this at home would be appreciated.

When things go wrong and someone says something inappropriate to you

- I don't like it when you say that
- Tell someone - at school as soon as possible

When things go wrong and you hear someone say something inappropriate to another person - be an upstander (stand up for others)

- I (we) don't like that language at Papanui
- Tell someone - at school as soon as possible
- Check that the person who was being spoken to is OK

APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE

At Papanui Primary School we expect everyone to use appropriate language.

Appropriate language is;

- Using kind words not hurtful words
- Good language and not swearing
- Used to include people - not make them feel alone or not respected
- Said with a nice tone and volume – not threatening or nasty
- Calling people by their proper names

Sometimes inappropriate language comes out when we are very upset. In that case ...

1. Calm down
2. Go to a safe place or person
3. Get some help – use your words – “I’m feeling ...”
4. Deal with the problem that made you angry
5. Then talk about the inappropriate language
